


SEASONAL REMINDERS

WINTER PARKING ENDS APRIL 1

Backyard Fires

Burn only clean, dry wood; no treated lumber, leaves, trash, furniture, etc.

The base of the fire cannot be wider than three feet in diameter, flames cannot be higher than two feet.

Fire to be contained in a fire ring of noncombustible material and located at least 25 feet from any structure.

Water source must be close at hand.

Someone must tend to the fire until it is extinguished.

Fire must not produce smoke that causes discomfort or a negative impact to neighboring properties. Anyone experiencing discomfort or negative impact due to a fire in the neighborhood is asked to call 911.

Branches/Brush Disposal

From mid-April to October, residents may dispose of brush and branches (under 8 inches in diameter), for a nominal fee, at Public Works, 1900 Hadley, during the hours of 7:30 AM and 3 PM, Monday through Friday.

Feeding Wildlife

Please remember that the feeding of wildlife (like deer) or water fowl (like geese) is not allowed in the city and that bird feeders need to be at least five feet above the ground or structure, such as a deck.

Hydrant Flushing

Typically in early May, all the hydrants throughout the City are flushed to clear out impurities, particularly iron deposits, that build up over the winter months. The flushing process may create a temporary interruption to your water service and/or discolor the water coming out of your faucet. In the case of discolored water, run the cold water for a few minutes.

Mailbox or Sod Damage

Properly installed mailboxes accidentally toppled by the blade of a snow plow will be replaced by Public Works as soon as time allows. If preferred, a new mailbox can be provided to the property owner to install. Please call 651-730-2740.

If a snow plow caused sod damage, you can choose whether to have the city provide you with sod for you to

place in the damaged area or the city will repair the area with topsoil and seed. Please call 651-730-2740.

Parking by Mailboxes

To allow for the unobstructed delivery, vehicles must park at least 10 feet away from either side of all mailboxes between the hours of 8 AM and 6 PM, Monday-Saturday.

Storm Sewers

Only melted snow, sump pump discharge, and rain should enter the storm drain in your neighborhood. Yard waste (leaves, grass clippings), automotive fluids, and pet waste entering storm drains flow to our lakes, rivers, and, wetlands and is a major source of pollution.

Sump Pumps

Please route the hose outside to the street, storm sewer, or wetland. The flow that enters the sanitary sewer system through toilets, wash tubs, and floor drains is sent to the treatment plant in Saint Paul. The flow is metered and Oakdale and its utility customers, like you, are charged for additional flow. Having a sump pump discharge into the toilets, wash tubs, or floor drains in your home is illegal.

Watering Lawns and Gardens

Oakdale operates under a year round, odd-even watering schedule: even numbered addresses can water on even numbered days and odd numbered addresses on odd numbered days.

Wetland Protection

Please keep grass clippings, leaves, and animal excrement away from areas adjacent to wetlands. Also please remember to not cut or mow the natural growth around wetlands as it acts as a filter to reduce or eliminate harmful sediments from entering the water and creating algae - and geese don't like it!

Winter Parking

Oakdale's winter parking ends April 1. Parking rules are: vehicles may not park on city streets from midnight to 5 AM - or anytime snow accumulation equals or exceeds two inches until the street is plowed.

ADOPT A STORM DRAIN



Looking for an easy – and very important – way help Minnesota's lakes, rivers, and wetlands be cleaner and healthier?

HIGHWAY 36 ROAD RESURFACING PROJECT

This spring, the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) will begin a road resurfacing project on Highway 36 between Edgerton Street in Ramsey County and Greeley Street in Washington County. The construction covers a 12-mile stretch of Highway 36 and will impact traffic in the cities of Lake Elmo, Little Canada, Maplewood, North Saint Paul, Oak Park Heights, Oakdale, Pine Springs, and Stillwater.

The project will include resurfacing existing pavement, improving pedestrian accessibility, and updating the drainage system under the roadway. Motorists can expect weekend directional closures with detours, single lane traffic, lane closures, and flagging in specific locations.

MnDOT realizes the project will create some inconveniences for businesses, customers and

other members of the public, and motorists traveling on Highway 36 and will try to minimize traffic impacts as much as possible. Once the project has been completed in late fall 2022, motorists traveling on that portion of Highway 36 will experience a smoother ride quality, better pedestrian accessibility, and improved drainage.

Winners receive an award and a garden center gift card; plus the city will display an Acorn Award sign at the winning properties for a few weeks!

There's also a new "Kid's Garden" category for kids ages 12 and under. For this category, submit name, address, telephone number of parent or guardian, up to five photos of your garden (any type, any size) and an essay (50 words or less) titled "Why I Love to Garden" by June 10.

Following the trend of some other communities, the City Council has removed the requirement for dogs and cats to have a city-issued license.

Dogs and cats do still need to have an ID tag on their collar displaying their owner's contact information so they can be easily reunited.

The City Council has taken action to allow Utility Task Vehicles (UTVs) to drive on local city streets.

Before hitting the road, owners need to apply for a permit, in person, at City Hall, 1584 Hadley Avenue. Owners will be provided with a map showing where they may travel on their UTV and a window decal.



There is no fee for the annual permit.

OAKDALE DISCOVERY CENTER AND NATURE PRESERVE

The Oakdale Discovery Center is nestled within the wooded and scenic 200-acre Oakdale Nature Preserve and offers rotating art exhibits, aquarium, wildlife exhibits, book and movie exchange, facility rental, and a fireplace with cozy seating. Nearby, discover a historic one-room schoolhouse, plenty of trails, forest garden, floating boardwalk over Mud Lake, and fitness stations.



NORDIC WALKING POLES

Turn your ordinary walk into a total body exercise that delivers far more motivating results and makes walking more fun with Nordic Walking poles! Poles, resembling ski poles, are used to involve the upper extremities when you walk, toning and firming every major muscle at the same time. Rubber tips for use on pavement reduce the impact of the hard surface. Stop by the Discovery Center during regular hours of operation and check out a pair of Nordic Walking Poles at no cost. Photo ID required. Adult sizes only.

BOOK AND MOVIE SWAP

Bring gently used books and DVD movies to the Discovery Center and swap them for something new. Books must be in good, readable condition, with the cover intact. Movies must be fully operable and in their original case. An even exchange: books for books and DVDs for DVDs. No VHS tapes accepted.

SCAVENGER HUNT

Pick up the Scavenger Hunt Guide (available April 1) at the Discovery Center and then head out into the wild for a scavenger hunt! Prizes will be given to those who find items listed in the guide. (Prizes age 12 and under appropriate).

DISCOVERY BACKPACKS

Stop at the Discovery Center and check out one of our Discovery Backpacks - at no cost. Inside the pack you will find everything needed for a fun exploration into the Oakdale Nature Preserve. Locate animal tracks and identify trees. Use binoculars to catch a glimpse of the deer, fox, raccoons and some of the 162 birds that call the Oakdale Nature Preserve home. You'll be surprised at all that this beautiful, 200 acre park has for you to discover.

TANDEM BIKES

(Available early April, weather permitting) Two tandem bikes are available for use at the Discovery Center so bring a date, a significant other, family member, or friend during regular hours of operation and check one out. Simply present your driver's license and you'll be on your way!

DISCOVERY CENTER BEE HIVE

The resident bee hive will return in May. Check out the live bee hive through August to see how real bees get their work done. This real, live bee hive is courtesy of local beekeepers, Karen and Duane Vay. You can view the bee hive safely indoors during open hours of the Discovery Center.

BINOCULARS

Binoculars are now available for check out at no cost during regular hours of operation. Simply present your driver's license and head out in search of birds.

SNOWSHOE RENTAL

Bring your family and friends to enjoy snowshoeing within the 200 acres of the Oakdale Nature Preserve. Watch for animal tracks, deer, fox, and birds. Sizes for both children and adults available. First come first served. Reservations recommended for groups of 6 or more by calling 651-747-3860.




