NEW PUBLIC WORKS FACILITY PROJECT BEGINS

The City is in the final stages of preparation for construction to start in Spring 2024.

With the support of voters in November, a new Public Works facility will be coming to Oakdale in the next few years. Throughout the remainder of 2023 and into early 2024, the facility project team will finalize the building design and begin preparation for construction. The City expects to break ground in Spring of 2024.

“The City has been working on planning for a new Public Works facility since 2018, and we’re thrilled to enter into final planning and construction stages,” said City Administrator Christina M. Volkers. “This will be the first new City facility in over 20 years. Thanks to the support of Oakdale residents and businesses, the community can expect a modern and fully-functional Public Works facility in the near future.”

In March, the City solicited proposals for a construction manager and finalized an agreement with Kraus-Anderson on May 9, which rounds out the project team that also includes the City of Oakdale and the project architect firm, Hagen, Christensen & McIlwain Architects.

At the April 11 City Council meeting, the City formally accepted a donation from 3M of a 9.2-acre parcel of land for the future Public Works campus, located on the southwest corner of 32nd Street N and Granada Avenue N. In 2020, 3M planned to donate the land to the City of Oakdale after conducting additional environmental investigations and site clean-up to prepare for redevelopment of the land. This clean-up work is funded by 3M and is anticipated to conclude before frost out in 2024.

Prior to breaking ground, the project team will finalize the building design and materials, draft construction documents, and secure bids and hire a construction firm. Preparation of the site will include procurement, surveying and staging processes.

CONSTRUCTION SEASON

Construction season is upon us in Minnesota, and there is a lot happening in Oakdale. Have you wondered what that big crane is for, or why certain streets are closed? Here are answers to those questions and updates on projects in Oakdale:

- **Gold Line Bus Rapid Transit (BRT):** The Metropolitan Council started constructing a bridge over Interstate 94 connecting Helmo Avenue N in Oakdale with Bielenberg Drive in Woodbury. Demolition in the area is complete, and bridge work continues through 2023. There may be intermittent closures in the area. Please follow posted signage for closures and detours.
- **Impact Apartments:** Norhart continues building the Impact Apartments just north of Interstate 94 near the future Helmo Station. This seven-story building will be the tallest building in Oakdale when complete.
- **4Front Office and Campus:** The exterior of a 200,000-square foot office/warehouse building is complete north of 34th Street N and east of Interstate 694 on the 4Front Campus. Interior work will continue this summer on the project by United Properties.
- **Willowbrooke:** Several developers are finishing more single-family homes, townhomes and the Springs Apartments in the Willowbrooke neighborhood. Work has started on a 190-unit apartment complex.
- **Tartan High School:** Framing for the new gymnasium is visible off of 10th Street N. The project, which is led by ISD 622, also includes additions and renovations for the kitchen and cafeteria, media center, classrooms and labs. Construction should finish prior to the start of the 2023-2024 school year.
- **40th Street N, East of Interstate 694:** Contractors have resumed work on the 40th Street N City project that began in 2022. The road will remain closed until work is complete, which is anticipated in late June.
- **Lift Station 6:** Contractors will finish work on replacement and relocation of Lift Station 6 at the intersection of Stillwater Boulevard and Ideal Avenue. This City project is expected to finish by July.
- **Water Tower 2 Repainting:** In March, T-Mobile removed cellular equipment from Water Tower 2, located on the southwest side of Eberle Park. A temporary tower will be placed to the northwest. City painting is expected to be done in mid-June. Please stay clear of work areas during this time.
- **Annual Street Improvement Project:** Construction is underway for the City's annual Street Improvement Program. These projects include road resurfacing and overlays. To receive updates, scan the code.

ANNUAL DRINKING WATER REPORT

Each year the City must make available its annual report on drinking water which includes information about source water, levels of contaminants and compliance with drinking water rules. The 2021 report is currently available online, and the 2022 report will be available for viewing later this summer. UTILITY BILLING SOFTWARE

The City is in the process of transitioning to a new utility billing software. Customers can expect a new look to their bills and a variety of convenient, secure options for bill pay. This transition is expected to take place this fall, and more information will be provided to residents and commercial customers later this summer.



SEASONAL REMINDERS



BRANCH/BRUSH DISPOSAL

Public Works accepts branches and brush under eight inches in diameter for a nominal fee. Drop off hours are Monday to Friday, 7:30 AM to 3 PM, through the third Friday in October. No grass clippings or bagged leaves are allowed for drop off at the Public Works building (1900 Hadley Avenue N).

ILLICIT DISCHARGE

Only rain, melted snow and sump pump discharge should enter storm drains. Yard waste, automotive fluids, pet waste or other illicit discharge that enters a storm sewer can flow into lakes, rivers and ponds causing pollution. Report illegal dumping or illicit discharge if you see it. Please do not dispose of grass clippings, animal excrement or other discharge into ponding areas, which can also affect water quality of wetlands and lakes.

IRRIGATION

Oakdale operates under a year-round odd-even watering schedule. Odd-numbered addresses are allowed to water on odd-numbered days. Even-numbered addresses are allowed to water on even-numbered days. Residents and businesses are encouraged to refrain from watering during 10 AM and 5 PM when water loss is greatest.

MAILBOX PARKING

To allow for unobstructed delivery of mail, vehicles must park at least 10 feet away from either side of all mailboxes from 8 AM to 6 PM, Monday to Saturday.

PROPERTY COMPLAINTS

Have a concern about a neighboring property? Scan the code to complete the online form or call 651-702-5225. You must live within 200 feet of the subject property or be able to see it from your own property. All reports are anonymous.



OUTDOOR WARNING SIRENS

Outdoor warning sirens are tested at 1 PM on the first Wednesday of each month, March through October.

TALL GRASS

Beginning June 1, grass must be kept at a maximum of six inches, cut at least every two weeks, and weeds kept under control. When the City receives a complaint, the property owner has five days to cut the grass, or the City will cut the grass and charge the property owner.

TREE MAINTENANCE

The City has several sizes of buckthorn wrenches available for residents to borrow. Call 651-730-2740 to check availability. Residents are encouraged to use only licensed tree service companies for tree removal or pruning. Licensed tree services are listed on the City website.



- Pet parents must be in verbal control of their dogs at all times to prevent aggressive behavior, biting, fighting and excessive barking.
- Pet parents must be 16 years or older and not handling more than two dogs.
- Pet parents must clean up and dispose of waste.
