RESIDENT RESOURCE: Important Stuff to Know

BACKYARD (RECREATIONAL) FIRES are allowed when:

- The base of the fire does not exceed 3' in diameter
- Flames do not exceed 2' in height
- Fire is contained in a fire ring of noncombustible material
- Fire ring is located at least 25' from any structure
- Water source is in close proximity
- Fire is attended to until extinguished
- Only clean, dry wood is burned; not treated lumber, leaves, trash, furniture, etc.
- Fire may not produce smoke that causes discomfort or a negative impact to neighboring properties.

BOULEVARDS / EASEMENTS. A boulevard is typically the property in your front yard, starting at the curb and going in 10'. It's an area for utilities, mailboxes, hydrants, street lights, street and traffic signs, and used for snow storage. There are also easements in your yard to provide access to cable, water, sewer, and telephone service by providers. Placing landscaping, underground sprinklers, fencing, invisible fencing, or structures in these areas makes them susceptible to possible damage when the city or other service providers are working in those areas; repair costs are the responsibility of the homeowner. BRANCHES / BRUSH DISPOSAL. For a nominal fee, Public Works accepts branches / brush (under 8" in diameter). Address: 1900 Hadley. Hours: Monday-Friday, 7:30 am to 3 pm).

CALL BEFORE DIGGING. Planning to dig posts, do landscaping or gardening, or otherwise disturb or excavate soil? Call Gopher State's Call at 811 at least 48 hours *before you dig* to get the "all clear"!

DIAL-A-RIDE. Transit Link serves areas where regular transit route service is not available. Transit Link is available from 6 am to 7 pm, Monday-Friday. To reserve a ride, please call 651-602-5465 up to five business days in advance.

FREE CABLE (channels 6, 14, 15, 16 (local government access), 20, 95, and 98). Call 651-747-3801 and ask for the free "Universal Coverage Channels".

HOME IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS? Call the Building Inspection Department for permits, building code information, safety requirements, or general questions. The department opens at 7 am, Monday through Friday, now to October: 651-739-5150.

OAKDALE GARDEN CLUB. Join the Oakdale Garden Club, call Michelle at 651-702-9017.

PARKING BY MAILBOXES. Vehicles cannot park within 10' of either side of the mailbox during these times: Monday to Saturday between 8 am and 6 pm.

PETS. Not everyone enjoys the company of pets or wants others' pets in their yard. Please take care that your pet does not disturb others by: controlling barking; keeping pets restrained in your yard and on a leash when off your property; confining pets in heat; and picking up your pet's droppings.

PETS IN PARKS. For the enjoyment of all who walk, ride, or live in our parks, pet owners are reminded to hold onto their leashed dog at all times, especially when in the Oakdale Nature Preserve. Also, to utilize the Mutt Mitt dog waste dispensers.

PROPERTY COMPLAINTS. Have a concern with a neighboring property? Please use the "Code - Property Complaint Form" found under "Living Here" on the city's web page or call (651) 702-5225.

RECREATIONAL VEHICLES. Throughout the year, each property is allowed to keep one recreational vehicle outside; whether it's in the side or rear yard (at least 5' from property line) or on the driveway (snowmobiles from November 1 to April 30; other vehicles from May 1 to November 1). Having more recreational vehicles is fine provided only one is outside. Questions? Please call 651-702-5225.

SEVERE WEATHER ALERTS. Outdoor warning sirens are tested at 1 pm on the first Wednesday of each month.

SEWER BACK-UPS. If your property experiences a problem with the public sewer system, call Public Works at 651-730-2740 *immediately* -- before contacting a private drain cleaning service.

TALL GRASS. Grass at all properties in the city needs to be kept to a maximum height of 6", cut at least every two weeks between May 15 and October 15, and weeds kept under control. When the city gets a complaint about tall grass, the property owner has up to five days to cut the grass or the city cuts the grass and bills / assesses the property owner. To report tall grass or weeds, please use the "Report Tall Grass" form on the city's web page or call (651) 702-5225.

TREE REMOVAL OR PRUNING. Don't go out on a limb by hiring a tree service company that is not licensed by the city. Call 651-730-2739 or go to www.ci.oakdale.mn.us and search "Tree Service".

WATERING LAWNS AND GARDENS. Lawn care experts say "watering thoroughly but infrequently" is the best course of action for a healthy yard. Minnesota's natural resources are limited and need to be preserved; as such, Oakdale operates under a year round, odd-even watering schedule. Questions? Please call 651-730-2740.

WILDLIFE AND WATER FOWL. Please remember that feeding wildlife or water fowl is not allowed. Bird feeders need to be at least 5' above the ground or structure.

Trash and Recycling Containers



Except on collection day, your trash and recycling containers need to be stored on the side or back of your house / garage or inside the garage or shed. If storing them in a front area in your yard is your only option, please call 651-730-2727 to learn about screening options.

PLACE PLANNED FOR PUPS

Dogs and their owners are excited about an off-leash dog park coming to town! The park will be developed on a 4.6 acre city-owned site on 50th Street, between Helena Road and Heather Ridge Road.

It is anticipated that the dog park will open in June following the installation of fencing and wood-chipped areas. Future improvements might include off-street parking and a separate area for smaller dogs.

Rules have been developed for the park such as having dogs leashed prior to entering or before leaving the fenced area. Dogs must also be currently licensed and vaccinated and play nice.

END OF THE LINE FOR TRAIN WHISTLES?

In early 2016, the Oakdale City Council initiated a "Quiet Zone" study to learn more about what would be needed to greatly reduce or eliminate the sound of train whistles in the community. To accomplish this, the city would be required to increase safety measures at each of the four crossings: TH 120, Granada Avenue, Hadley Avenue, and Inwood.


In March, 2017, the City Council approved plans for improved train crossings at the four locations. The project is now being reviewed by the Federal Railroad Association.

HIGHWAY 36 AND HADLEY AVENUE PROJECT PREVIEW

Although construction is a few years out, here's some information about plans to modify the Hadley Avenue and TH 36 intersection. The project, headed up by Washington County, includes connecting Hadley Avenue via a bridge over Highway 36, adding interchange ramps, and adding a pedestrian bridge for the Gateway Trail crossing. A series of roundabouts on Hadley Avenue, as shown on the drawing provided, are being reviewed by the Minnesota Department of Transportation. If all goes as planned, construction will begin in 2019. Do you know that Bethke Park offers native wildflowers, Horseshoe Park offers horseshoe pits, and Northdale Park offers an archery range? Go to "Recreation" at www.ci.oakdale.mn.us and check out the interactive button on the "Parks" page!

Hours: City parks open 1/2 hour before sunrise and close 1/2 hour after sunset. Exceptions: lighted tennis courts, ballfields, skating rinks, and for organized sports.

Leashes: Dogs, cats, and other pets are allowed in city parks (*with the exception of Tanners Beach*) but need to be leashed.

Mutt Mitts: For your convenience, Mutt Mitts dispensers are provided in our parks to easily collect and dispose of dog waste. Left on the ground, dog waste is not only unsightly but it pollutes the water and poses health risks.

EDER ONE-ROOM SCHOOL HOUSE

Built in 1888 as District #12 of Washington County. It closed in 1920 and became a storage shed for the Eder family until it was moved to the Oakdale Nature Preserve and restored by the Oakdale-Lake Elmo Historical Society in 2004. The Discovery Center, located at 4444 Hadley Avenue, is nestled within the picturesque Oakdale Nature Preserve. The award-winning facility provides visitors a quiet place of reflection and a unique education experience. The center has space available for rent for meetings and events.

Visit often to take in the rotating art exhibits, aquarium, "hands-on" wildlife exhibit room, book and movie exchange, and to just sit by the fire or on the patio. There is also a picnic shelter, forest garden, boardwalk, fitness stations, and plenty of walking trails.

DISCOVERY BACKPACKS

Stop at the Discovery Center and check out one of our "Discovery Backpacks." Inside the packs you will find everything needed for a summertime exploration into the adjacent nature preserve. Seek out animal tracks, identify different types of trees and flowers, go on a scavenger hunt, use binoculars to bird watch or catch a glimpse of the deer, fox and owls that call the nature preserve home. Catch interesting critters using the insect net. Packs are even equipped with GPS units!

DISCOVER: Geocaching

Do you like exploring the outdoors? Then try out the fun and exciting hobby of geocaching, a high tech treasure hunt using GPS units to locate caches hidden throughout the world. There are currently 15 caches located in the Oakdale Park System. Stop by the Discovery Center and receive a hand-out of the caches and coordinates and head out to discover as many as you can! The Recreation Department has handheld GPS units available for you to check-out. Geocaching is a great outdoor activity for all ages!

DISCOVER: Nordic Walking Poles

Using Nordic Walking Poles, turn your ordinary walk into a total body exercise that delivers far more motivating results and makes walking more fun! Poles resembling ski poles are used to involve the upper extremities when you walk, toning and firming every major muscle at the same time. The poles are designed using rubber tips making it possible to use them on pavement while reducing the impact of the hard surface. Stop by the Discovery Center during regular business hours and check out a pair of our *NEW* Nordic Walking Poles at no cost! Simply present a photo I.D. and then walk away! Adult sizes available.

DISCOVER: Scavenger Hunts

Head out on the trails in the Oakdale Nature Preserve for a scavenger hunt and the chance to win prizes! First stop at the front desk of the Discovery Center and ask for the scavenger hunt guide. All new prizes (age 12 and under appropriate) will be awarded.

DISCOVER: Tandem Bikes

Accommodates Both Adults & Kids!

We have two tandem bikes available for use including one that will accommodate youth sizes! Stop by the Discovery Center during regular hours and check one out. Simply present your driver's license and you will be off on your "joy ride."

DISCOVER: Live Hive

The Discovery Center's working hive - buzzing with busy bees is on display now through October. View the hive (courtesy of resident and beekeeper AJ Moses) from a safe, indoor vantage point during Discovery Center hours.

BEEKEEPING and HONEY EXTRACTION EVENT

Join us on Thursday, August 24, for our annual beekeeping and honey extraction event at the Discovery Center.

From 6 to 8 pm, resident and local beekeeper, AJ Moses, will demonstrate how to extract honey from the center's live hive. He will also give tips on how to be a successful beekeeper.



ADULT CAMP: Summer Hobby Farm



This one-day camp is designed for active adults who want to experience the outdoors while staying close to home. Take this opportunity to try a new activity or revisit one that you haven't done for years. Several outdoor naturalist programs are included to make this camp a learning and recreational experience.

PROPER DISPOSAL OF JUST ABOUT ANYTHING!

Recycling paper, plastics, aluminum, and glass at curbside has become second nature to most people. But what do you do with an old refrigerator or mattress or car battery you want to dispose of?

Washington County has developed a Disposal Directory that will make it easy for you to figure out how to get rid of unwanted, unusual or bulky items (and just about anything else). To use the directory, go to the Washington County website, (www.co.washington.mn.us) and type "Disposal Directory" into the search box. Tap Disposal Directory again, and type in the name of the item you want to dispose. A list of disposal options will pop up. It's that simple!

PROTECT WETLAND BUFFER AREAS

Ponds, lakes, storm water pond areas, drainage areas, and even dry wetlands are all categorized as wetlands. It is important to protect them because they provide many functions such as flood moderation, groundwater recharge, water quality improvement, wildlife habitat, and aesthetics.

You can help protect the city's wetlands by protecting the buffer areas around them.

Many homeowners mistakenly clear brush and mow grass within the buffer and wetland areas. These activities adversely affect the soil structure and the type of plants that grow in the area. Even clearing a small swath through the buffer to allow better visibility or access to the wetland can create problems. Also, fertilizers and pesticides (plant and insect killers) used near the buffer can alter the ecological balance.

Unfortunately, a common practice is to throw lawn clippings, wood chips, and other yard waste near or into wetlands. This results in a direct loss of the wetland's capacity to control flooding in your area. Additionally, dumping yard waste will cause changes in a wetland's chemical balance. Although yard waste is composed of natural materials that will eventually decompose, they can damage a wetland in the process.

CONSIDER ADOPTING A WETLAND

There are more than 250 water bodies in Oakdale! If you adopt one of our wetlands, you will help protect one of our city's great natural resources.

As a participant, we'd ask that you would occasionally do the following: clear trash and debris from the area, monitor whether neighbors are encroaching on the wetland buffer areas (such as mowing or placing yard waste in the area, for example), and monitor and remove invasive species.

Residents, community groups, homeowner associations, and businesses are encouraged to get involved by adopting a wetland! Participation provides a great opportunity to spend time by the water with friends, family and co-workers, not to mention the positive impact you will make on the environment!

PROTECT OAKDALE'S BODIES OF WATER

You may not think you have lake-front property, but consider this: liquids and solids from your driveway and / or yard can wash into the street, into the storm drains on your street and end up in our ponds, lakes, storm water pond areas, drainage areas, and wetlands.

Here are some things that can create contamination: oil, grass clippings and fertilizer, pet droppings tossed down storm drains or left along walkways or in parks and allowed to wash into storm sewers, leaves that accumulate in gutters and are washed down the street into the storm sewer.

Please take care to keep all these materials out of our street gutters, and ultimately out of storm drains and storm sewers. If you see others disposing of waste improperly, take time to remind them of their responsibility; or call the Public Works Department at 651-730-2740 to report.

CONSUMING VS. CONSERVING WATER

How much water do you consume in a day? Estimates vary, but it is believed each person uses about 80-100 gallons.

Why is it important to know this? Because water is scarce. Seventy percent of the water we use is from groundwater, and since 1995, the ground water elevation in our aquifer has decreased an average rate of 3 ½ inches per year.

How can the level in the aquifer be elevated? Primarily through rainfall. But less than 10 percent of our annual rainfall works its way through the soils to replenish the groundwater. (The remaining 90 percent is used by plants, is lost through evaporation, or runs off and discharges through storm sewers into lakes and streams.)

But we have the ability to make a positive impact on our aquifer's water level simply by conserving water. Here are some suggestions:

INDOORS

- Turn off the tap while shaving and brushing teeth.
- Take a shorter shower.
- Scrape dishes instead of rinsing them.
- Keep a pitcher of water in the refrigerator instead of running tap for cool water.
- Wash only full loads of clothing.
- Look for and repair leaks.

OUTDOORS

- Sweep sidewalks instead of hosing them off.
- Wash vehicle car using a bucket, or use a commercial car wash that recycles water.
- Cover pools and spas to reduce evaporation.
- Store run off in rain barrels and use to water gardens between rainstorms.
- Keep water off pavement while sprinkling.
- Inspect and repair clogged, broken, or missing sprinkler heads.
- Water in the morning or evening to prevent water loss via evaporation.
- Do not water if there has been one inch or more of rain during the previous week.
- Limit lawn watering during dry weeks to one inch per week. (Or let the lawn become dormant.)
- Water plants from watering can instead of from hose.
- Install a rain garden. For how to do it, go to the city's website (www.ci.oakdale.mn.us/) and type "rain gardens" in the search box.
- Consider native plantings in your yard. They seldom need watering, mulching, protection from frost, or continuous mowing. They also provide nectar, pollen, and seeds that serve as food for native butterflies, birds and other animals, and they protect soil with their deep and spreading root systems, helping to prevent erosion. For ideas, go to the Minnesota DNR website (www.dnr.state.mn.us) and type "native plants" in the search box.

RENEWABLE ENERGY PROGRAMS FROM XCEL ENERGY

If you're looking for ways to reduce your carbon footprint, you may want to consider one of the renewable energy programs offered by Xcel Energy. Your options are solar power, wind energy, or a combination of the two.

SOLAR POWER

Solar Rewards for Residences. With this option, you install solar panels at your home to help produce your own energy. If you produce more energy than you need, Xcel adds the energy to their grid and puts a credit on your bill.

Made in Minnesota. This is a solar incentive program run through the Minnesota Department of Commerce where you receive financial benefits for installing Minnesota-made solar energy systems.

Community Solar Garden Subscription. Third-party solar garden operators own and manage solar gardens. You can contract with these operators to purchase or lease a subscription to a solar garden. In return, you receive payment for your portion of the garden's solar energy production through Xcel's Solar Rewards Community program.

WIND POWER

Windsor. This is a program that allows you to pay a few dollars extra every month to get some or all your energy from wind energy already produced by Xcel. Your Windsor subscription is added to your Xcel Energy bill.

A BLEND OF WIND AND SOLAR POWER

Renewable Connect. With this option, you choose the amount of renewable energy you wish to subscribe to similar to the Community Solar Garden and Windsor programs, except it is a combination of wind and solar power. Pricing is locked in and there is no need to own equipment.
