RESIDENT RESOURCE: Important Stuff to Know

9-1-1: CALL IF YOU CAN, TEXT IF YOU CAN'T. You can now text 9-1-1 to reach dispatchers in Minnesota for situations when discretion is important to the safety of the caller or others, such as domestic violence situations or home invasions.

BACKYARD FIRES - THE RULES:

- The base of the fire not to exceed three feet in diameter.
- Flames not to exceed two feet in height.
- Fire is contained in a fire ring of noncombustible material.
- Fire ring is located at least 25 feet from any structure.
- Water source is in close proximity.
- Fire is attended to until extinguished.
- Only clean, dry wood is burned; not treated lumber, leaves, trash, furniture, etc.
- Fire may not produce smoke that causes discomfort or a negative impact to neighboring properties.

BOULEVARDS & EASEMENTS 101.

A boulevard is typically the property in your front yard, starting at the curb and going in 10 feet. The area is used for utilities, mailboxes, hydrants, street lights, street and traffic signs, and snow storage. Easements provide access to underground and overhead cable, water, sewer, and telephone services. Barriers such as landscaping, underground sprinklers, fencing, invisible fencing, and structures should not be placed in these areas. Doing so can make them susceptible to damage when repair or maintenance is performed; repair costs are the responsibility of the homeowner. Please call 651-739-5150 for more information.

BRANCHES & BRUSH DISPOSAL.

For a nominal fee, Public Works, 1900 Hadley, accepts branches / brush (under eight inches in diameter) during the summer. Drop off: M-F, 7:30 AM to 3 PM.

DIGGING. Planning to dig in your yard for posts, landscaping, gardening, or other? Call Gopher State's Call at 811 at least **48 hours before digging.**



DOG PARK.

The Oakdale Bark Park, the city's off-leash 4.6 acre dog park, located off 50th Street, between Helena Road and Heather Ridge Road, is open year round.

HOME IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS?

PARKING BY MAILBOXES.

Vehicles cannot park within 10 feet of either side of any mailbox during these times: Monday to Saturday between 8 AM and 6 PM.

PETS. Not everyone enjoys the company of pets or wants other pets in their yard. Please take care that your pet does not disturb others by: controlling barking, keeping pets restrained in your yard and on a leash when off your property, and confining pets when they are in heat.

THE POOP ON POOP. The spring thaw brings to light the sad reality that not everyone picks up after their dogs, especially when using the parks and trails in the city. So this is a good time to remind everyone: when leaving private property, on foot, accompanied by a dog, City code (Section 4-16) requires the human possess supplies, such as plastic bags, to collect and dispose of any excrement from the pup. This requirement is in effect year round and violating it carries a hefty penalty. Before heading out, gather up a few bags (shopping, newspaper, food storage) and place them in your pocket so you'll be fully prepared for a drop-and-stop, or two! If you're in a park, seek out a Mutt Mitt dispenser.

PROPERTY COMPLAINTS. Want to let the City know about an issue with a neighboring property? Go to www.ci.oakdale.mn.us and select the orange "Citizen Action Center" button or call 651-702-5225.

RECREATIONAL VEHICLES.

Each property is allowed to keep one recreational vehicle outside; whether it's in the side or rear yard (at least five feet in from your property line) or on the driveway (snowmobiles from November 1 to April 30; other vehicles from May 1 to November 1). Having more recreational vehicles at your property is fine as long as only one is outside. Questions? Please call 651-702-5225.

SEWER BACK-UPS. If your property experiences a problem with the public sewer system, call Public Works at 651-730-2740 immediately -- before contacting a private drain cleaning service.

TALL GRASS. Grass at all properties needs to be kept to a maximum height of six inches, cut at least every two weeks between May 15 and October 15, and weeds kept under control. When the City gets a complaint about tall grass, the property owner has up to five days to cut the grass or the City will cut the grass and charge the property owner. To report tall grass or weeds, go to www.ci.oakdale.mn.us and select the orange "Citizen Action Center" button or call 651-702-5225.

TIRES: HAVE THEM PICKED UP

FOR FREE! During the summer, Minnesota Mosquito Control will pick up tires at your home at no cost. Please call 651-645-9149 to schedule a pick up.

TRASH & RECYCLING CONTAINER

PLACEMENT. Except on your trash collection day, trash and recycling containers need to be stored on the side or back of your house / garage or inside a garage or shed. Or call 651-730-2727 to learn about screening options.

TREE REMOVAL OR PRUNING.

Don't go out on a limb by hiring a tree service company that has not been licensed by the City. Go to www.ci.oakdale.mn.us and search "Tree Services License" or call 651-730-2739.

WATERING LAWNS & GARDENS.

During the hot summer months, Oakdale water utility customers often use up to six million gallons of water per day — nearly three times the amount used during the rest of the year! While most of us enjoy having a lush, green landscape during the height of our outdoor activities, large numbers of us watering at the same time can cause stress to the water distribution system. Alternating our outdoor watering days helps conserve valuable water resources and assists your water utility in meeting peak summer demands. Remember to follow Oakdale's year round, odd-even watering schedule. Questions? Please call 651-730-2740.

WILDLIFE AND WATER FOWL.

Please remember that the feeding wildlife (like deer) or water fowl (like geese) is not allowed in the City and that bird feeders need to be at least five feet above the ground or structure, such as a deck.

USING LESS WATER SAVES MONEY AND PROTECTS NATURAL RESOURCES

Do you know that the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources has set a goal for every Minnesotan to use less than 75 gallons of water per day?

Do you know that your water meter and your quarterly statement can provide you with a wealth of information on your water usage and can even alert you to a potential leak?

WONDERING HOW YOUR WATER USAGE COMPARES TO THAT OF AN AVERAGE MINNESOTAN? LET'S TAKE A LOOK AT YOUR ACCOUNT!

Set a copy of your most recent water and sewer invoice in front of you (printed or via your online account). Find where it says "1000 Gallons". The various levels show your water usage for the past billing quarters (note: graph for online accounts does not display number on columns). Total the number of gallons from the four bars shown on the right and moving to the left.

THREE EXAMPLES

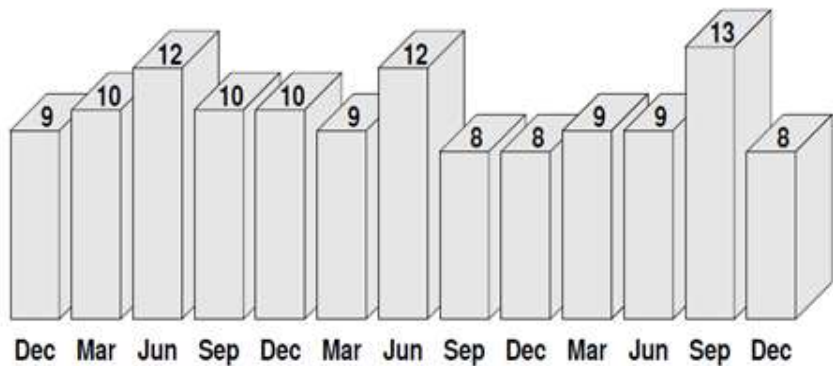
In Example #1, the total is $8+13+9+9=39$, or 39,000 gallons. The total divided by 365 days is 106.8 gallons used per day; then divided by the number of people in the household (2) equals: 53.42 gallons of water used per day, on average. *Way to go, Example #1!*

The Example #2 customer uses much more water during the summer months due to an irrigation system. Their total water usage for the past year is $10+66+55+11=142,000$ gallons. The total divided by 365 days is 389.0 gallons used per day; divided by the number of people in the household (2) equals: 194.5. *Installing a smart controller on their irrigation system might be just the ticket for using less water.*

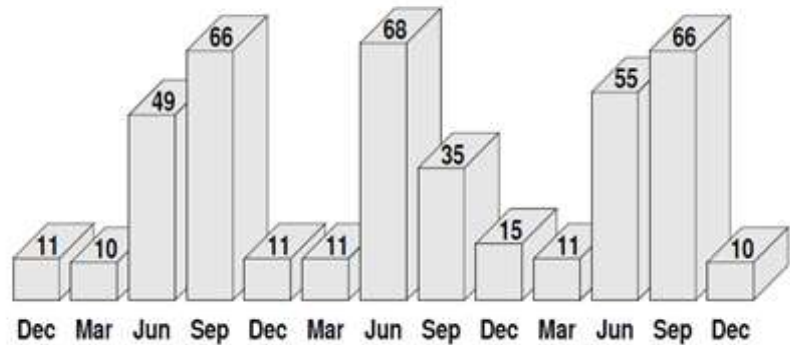
The Example #3 customer appears to have a dripping faucet, running toilet, or, perhaps, a water softener stuck in regeneration mode. The customer should put on their detective hat and locate and repair the culprit(s). Their total water usage for the past year is $55+49+43+43=190,000$ gallons. The total divided by 365 days is 520.6 gallons used per day; divided by the number of people in the household (2) equals: 260.3 gallons of water used per day, on average. *Call the City at 651-730-2710 to request a free toilet dye test kit and a pamphlet on finding and fixing leaks.*

The Oakdale households used in these three examples are actual accounts. Because the residents have lived at their current address for three years or more, their invoices offer total usage for over 12 billing cycles.

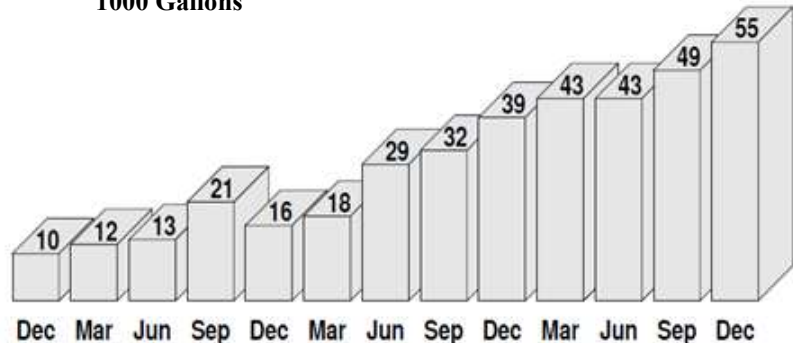

The water meter in your home has a "leak indicator" that flashes for an intermittent leak or is on constant display for a continuous leak. The indicator looks like a faucet icon and is displayed on your water meter's LCD screen. The LCD screen is easily activated by a flashlight. If the leak icon is displayed, track down and fix any leak(s).

ELECTION 2018 Q&A

Primary / Special Election: August 14 **General / Special Election: November 6**

Q. Why will the August 14 Primary Election ballot include a Special Election for the Office of Mayor?

A. In December 2016, following the resignation of Mayor Stan Karwoski, Council Member Reinke was appointed to serve as mayor until a successor is elected at a special election. The date of the Special Election was set for August 14, 2018, the same day as the Primary Election. The person elected as mayor on August 14 will be sworn in that month and serve *until* the first Monday of January 2019.

Q. What is the candidate filing period for the August 14 Special Election?

A. Persons may file at Oakdale City Hall, 1584 Hadley Avenue, from May 22 to June 5. The fee is \$5.

Q. The November 6 General Election ballot will also include the Office of Mayor. Why?

A. Voters need to elect a mayor to serve the next four year term. The person elected as mayor will be sworn in January 2019 and serve until December 2022.

Q. Why will the November 6 General Election ballot include a Special Election for a two-year council member seat?

A. In April 2017, following the resignation of Council Member Kristen Cici, Mark Landis was appointed to serve as council member until a successor is elected at a special election. The date of the Special Election was set for November 6, 2018, the same day as the General Election. The person elected to this seat will be sworn in January 2019 and serve until December 2020.

Q. Will the General Election ballot include any other offices for Oakdale?

A. Yes, two council member seats will be on the ballot. Persons elected will be sworn in January 2019 and serve until December 2022.

Q. What is the candidate filing period for the November 6 Election? Persons may file at Oakdale City Hall from July 31 to August 14. The fee is \$5.

Q. How do I learn more about the candidates running for mayor and city council?

A. The Oakdale Area Chamber of Commerce typically hosts a candidate's forum prior to the General Election. Watch the city's web site for information on date and time.

Q. Do I need to register to vote each election year?

A. You only need to register if (1) your name or address has changed, (2) you have not voted in the past four years, or (3) if this is your first time voting. You can register ahead of time at www.mnvotes.org or you can register at your polling place on election day by providing the required proof of residency.

Q. What's the best way to find out where I vote?

A. Enter your address at: <http://pollfinder.sos.state.mn.us> or call 651-730-2704.

Q. I used to be able to absentee vote at Oakdale City Hall. Would it be possible to do so this year?

A. Great news! Washington County has added Oakdale City Hall as its fifth in-person absentee voting location for the November 6 General Election. Voting begins September 21 and ends November 5. Other absentee voting locations are: Cottage Grove, Stillwater, Forest Lake, and Woodbury. Washington County residents may utilize any of these locations. Please note that Oakdale City Hall will not be a polling location on August 14 or November 6.

Q. Can I still absentee vote by mail?

A. Yes, but be sure to submit your absentee ballot application as early as possible! Apply at www.mnvotes.org or call 651-430-6175 to request an application.

Start Up Loan: The City of Oakdale is partnering with Minnesota Housing to provide affordable mortgages to first-time homebuyers through the Start Up loan program. Start Up offers fixed interest rates and down payment and closing cost loans up to \$12,000 for eligible first-time homebuyers. Buyers can purchase homes in Oakdale that cost up to \$306,000.

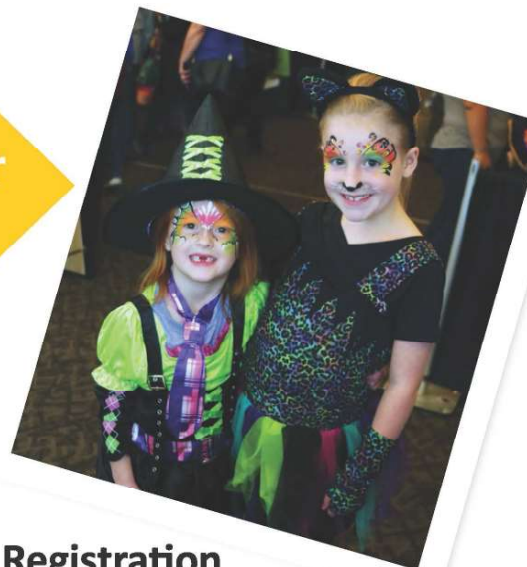

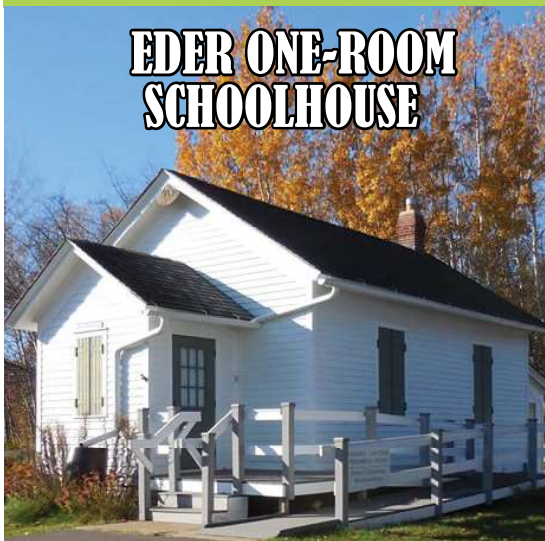

Lanesboro, in southeastern Minnesota, is the only part of the state not leveled by glaciers during the ice age. As the glaciers melted, massive runoffs carved deep valleys and gorges, creating a network of springs, streams, rivers, and subterranean waters. Lanesboro has been populated since Mammoth hunters walked the soil. Indian tribes left a rich history, and Irish and Norwegian immigrants settled here in the 1860s.

Today, the Amish work the fields and much of the little downtown area is on the National Register of Historic Places. The rich Amish heritage and present day lifestyles will be shared by a local guide during the driving tour of the businesses, residential districts, and the vibrant community surrounding Lanesboro. The culture and life of the Amish who live here will become evident as the opportunity for a view of a horse drawn buggy may become visible.

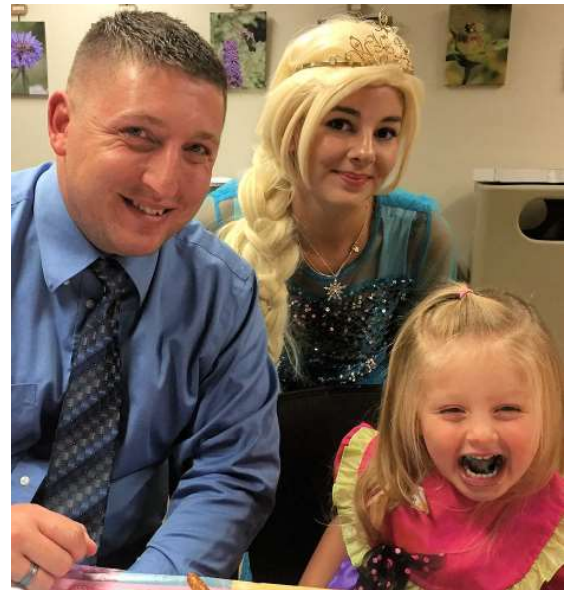

The City's off-leash dog park, the Oakdale Bark Park, is open year round and is located off 50th Street, between Helena Road and Heather Ridge Road.

The park is fenced with a transition corridor for unleashing and leashing your pup. Simply pull up on the gate release to enter or exit. The park also offers parking and sitting areas for pet parents.

Bark Park Rules:

- Dogs must be leashed prior to entering and upon leaving the off-leash area and in transition corridors.
- Dogs must be properly licensed, vaccinated and not designated as a dangerous dog or in heat.
- Dogs must stay within fenced area.
- Owners are liable for damage or injury inflicted by their dogs.
- Owners must be in verbal control of their dogs at all times and prevent aggressive behavior, biting, fighting or excessive barking.
- Owners must be 16 years or older, and not handling more than two dogs.
- Owners must clean up and dispose of pet waste. Dispensers and waste receptacles are provided.
- Owners must have a visible leash at all times.

Dogs certainly enjoy parks, but for the enjoyment of all who walk, ride, or live in our parks, pet owners are reminded to hold onto their leashed dog at all times when visiting parks (as per city ordinance).
